#### **AG Sector Showcase**

With the Department of Education, AITC-PEI delivered a virtual AG Sector Showcase to all Grade 10 Career Exploration Opportunities students and Agri-Science & Animal Science students. The showcase used a multi-pronged programming approach. A live panel session of young adults working in agriculture who shared their career journey and educational pathways, and answered live and submitted questions from our AG students took place, as well as a virtual farm tour with Island farmer, Deanna Doctor. There was also an educational resource video featuring

a virtual tour at Summerside Green Diamond Equipment Ltd., highlighting ag technicians' skills, abilities, training, responsibilities and opportunities, in addition to the PEI Agriculture Sector Council's Farm Technician Program, the PEI Apprenticeship Program Information and Supports, and Team Food Island Information for summer employment opportunities.

### **NEW BRUNSWICK**

#### **April is for Exploring Careers**

The theme for April in New Brunswick was careers. AITC-NB participated in two expos this month, with close to 4,000 students in attendance. Highlighting I AM AG and thinkAG resources, students learned about the Holland Code and their impact on the future of agriculture. Through a partnership with Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, AITC-NB organized two field trips to the local research centre for students in our high school AG110 course. Students learned about career opportunities in agriculture, met with scientists studying entomology and potato DNA, and had a hands-on lab focused on irrigation. Support of the AG110 course continued with two labs run at schools in Chipman and Rothesay, NB.

There was also a thrilling opportunity for teachers with the FCC-sponsored Teacher Farm Tour. In partnership with Nutrients for Life and the Elementary Council, nine teachers toured four farms, connecting with the farmers and increasing their knowledge. This was a very positive opportunity for the teachers, and they are looking forward to incorporating agriculture more in their classrooms.
