

Amazing Agriculture Adventure and Family Fun Night at Ag Expos

AITC-NL hosted in-person Amazing Agriculture Adventures (AAA) at the Agriculture Expos in Corner Brook and Grand Falls Windsor on September 20 and October 4. Over 500 students and teachers attend AAA, where students go from booth to booth and visit farmers and agriculture representatives to learn about the NL agriculture industry. Students and teachers participate in hands-on activities including making nutrient bracelets, living necklaces, animal farms, beekeeping displays and much more!

AITC-NL organizes a children's activity area during the Agriculture Expos hosted by the NL Federation of Agriculture. On the Friday

evening, AITC-NL hosts a Family Fun Night with special activities including painting pumpkin ornaments for children to take home, as well as, giving away storybooks. Saturday morning, Little Green Thumbs hosts a culinary demo where past LGT students make smoothies using local ingredients and share them with the public. Sunday morning, AITC-NL hosts "Story Time with a Farmer" where a farmer will read one of our storybooks and give out resources to participants. Throughout the weekend, AITC-NL promotes all AITC programming and makes connections with visiting teachers and students.

October is here and so are many engagement opportunities! Skills NB is hosting a try-a-trade event where AITC-NB will be showcasing robotics using the thinkAG programming. 
